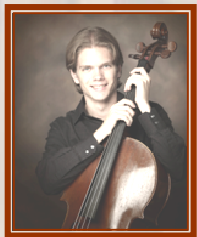
St. Albans Abbey Girls Choir Wednesday, April 14, 2010, 6:00pm

Camille Saint-Saëns - Celebrating 175 years Epiphany Choir and Orchestra Erik Åsgeirsson, cello Monday, May 17, 2010, 8:00pm

We are pleased to present works by Saint-Saëns to mark the 175-year anniversary of the birth of this talented child prodigy who composed prolifically. Written in 1865, Psaume XVIII is a rarely performed work for choir and orchestra based on the text, "The heavens declare the greatness of God." Also featured will be some of Saint-Saëns' most well-known pieces - the powerful Finale of Symphony III and his beautiful Cello Concerto in A minor. Our soloist will be the amazing young cellist, Erik Åsgeirsson, who has won numerous competitions and is currently doing graduate work at the Hochschule fur Musik in Cologne.
